Public transport (bus, tram, trolley car)


Finding the route

Public transport in the Belgrade city centre is frequent and there are plenty of bus, tram, and trolley car lines to get you around quickly and cheaply. There are a wide variety of public transport lines stopping within a maximum of ten minutes' walking distance from the Faculty of Philosophy. The best way to find your way by public transport is to use Google Maps or Moovit app (both available for iOS and Android). Both apps can offer routes from one location to another with live bus locations.

Tickets & the official public transport app

Ticket for one ride (up to 90 minutes from the purchasing time) costs approximately 0.43€ (50 dinars). Purchasing is done through an official public transport app which can be downloaded here for iOS, and here for Android. With this app, you can track the estimated arrival time of the busses based on your location and the bus station that you are at. We provide instructions on how to use this app below.

Purchasing a ticket

To purchase through the app, you need to create an account in the My Account menu. Follow the instructions to create your account. Then, if you want to purchase the ticket, press the yellow button that says ticket at the bottom of the screen. There follow the instructions to put in your card information and then the ticket will be purchased. During 90 minutes, the yellow button will remain green. When you press it, ticket info with a QR code will appear. This can be shown to inspectors if they happen upon your bus.

Always select A90 tickets as they are for the central part of Belgrade. It is highly unlikely that you will travel outside this zone as A zone is quite large and covers most of the urban Belgrade. Multi-day tickets (7 days) can also be purchased for approx. 6.83€ (800 dinars) but we recommend against that as it will likely cost you less to purchase individual tickets.

Taxi services

In Belgrade, you can use traditional taxi services and CarGo (a local Uber-like application). Uber, Bolt and similar services are not available.

Taxi services

There are plenty of taxi providers in Belgrade. We recommend Naxis taxi, Pink taxi. We link their websites in English where you can download their apps (if available), check the prices, etc. These all take card payments as well, but it can be useful to mention that at the beginning of the ride. These taxis are very frequent in the city centre and there is a taxi stand in front of the Faculty of Philosophy building.

IMPORTANT NOTE: Taxis in Belgrade have a registration plate BG (numbers) TX and all vehicles are white. If a car <u>only</u> has the taxi marking as the one in the picture on the right, the best is to avoid such vehicles and seek ones that have taxi lights with the names of the companies listed above.



CarGo

CarGo is a local Uber-like service. The app is available both for iOS and Android. Everything works mostly the same as all similar services such as Uber or Bolt, and the app is mostly the same. You will need to switch it to English first by opening the settings menu at the top right corner (denoted by three horizontal lines). There find the option Jezik and choose English from the menu. You also need to create an account and input payment details into the app to use it.
